## English and American Ales

### Imperial Stout

Originally produced in England for export to Catherine the Great's court (she did it with horses- and drank some bad ass beer). Americans have really taken to this style and in our opinion improved on it.

### Sweet Stout/Coffee Stout

Stouts with added sugars for sweetness. Sometimes the sugars are from oats, which also add body to the beer other times brewers will add lactose (milk sugar) to a beer, think sugar in your coffee, to cut the dry roasted bitterness.

### Farmhouse Ales- Saison/Belgian or Biere De Garde/French

A traditional approach to beer. These all have wheat, are usually un-spiced and are slightly higher in alcohol than Belgian Whites. They get their complexity from the particular yeasts that are employed in the fermentation. Saison translates to "Season" and is best enjoyed after a long spring/summer day working on the farm.

### Schwarzbier

Dark beers are not necessarily heavy or strong, they just have a roasted malt or grain added. These beers are great for that dry roastiness without the milkshake mouth feel. Extremely "light" bodied and smooth.

### Rauchbier

A unique style from Bamberg, Germany. Rauchbier is produced with grain dried over an open fire. This gives the brew a very smoky flavor.

### Bock/Strong Lager

Bocks (originally produced in Einbeck, Germany) are strong lagers with a smooth and sweet malt, ranging in color from golden to black. The German word bock translates to "Ram". Sick.

## English and American Ales

### Bitters/ESB

A bit of a misnomer, in England a bitter means a low alcohol ale that is mild and smooth, a session beer designed with mid-day conversation in mind. An extra special bitter (ESB) is a stronger bitter, the flavor still all about the malt but everything taken up a notch. Caramel, butter, and tefice. Mind the Gap.

### British Style Pale Ale

British pale ales are more about the caramel and toasted malts. In general British beers are striving to achieve a balance between malt and hops. The results are smooth, refreshing and extremely drinkable beers. Some American breweries have picked up the torch on this style.

### American Pale Ale

While some American breweries have picked up the torch on British style pale ales Anchor brewing threw down the gauntlet and decided that a pale ale should be lighter in color and more about the hops than the malt. These are essentially mild American IPAs.

### IPA (India Pale Ale)

Traditionally these were stronger pale ales with more hops (a preservative) so that the beer would make it to India for the conscripted soldiers, arguably a totally bullshit situation which resulted in a delicious beer. Americans have an obsession with hops. We love the green resin and citrusy, pine like blasts of dry bitterness and huge aroma.

### Amber/Hopped Amber Ales

Maltier pale ales with some caramelization of the sugars giving them an amber color, and nutty, malty flavors. For those on more of a hop mission, there are full bodied aggressively hopped amber ales too. Dig the International Bittering Units babies. (IBUs)

### Brown Ale

Denser malt for color, smooth full bodied beer. Think nutty sweetness.

### Porter

This dark, rich ale was originally a blend of 3 beers (Mild, Old Ale, Bitters). These days in the US it means a beer with roasted malts offering up a dry clean bitterness. Baltic porters are full bodied, rich porters, fermented with lager yeasts, resulting in higher alcohol, wine-like beers.

### Stout

Stout originally meant strong, so there were "stout porters". A misconception that persists is that a dark beer is somehow heavier or stronger than a lighter colored beer. Guinness seems heavier because nitrogen bubbles are smaller making it feel more like milk than water in your mouth, it is actually lighter than most beers. Today stouts are very dark, rich ales produced with unmalts roasted barley. The effect of British colonialism is apparent, as English style beers are still brewed in the far reaches of the former empire.
